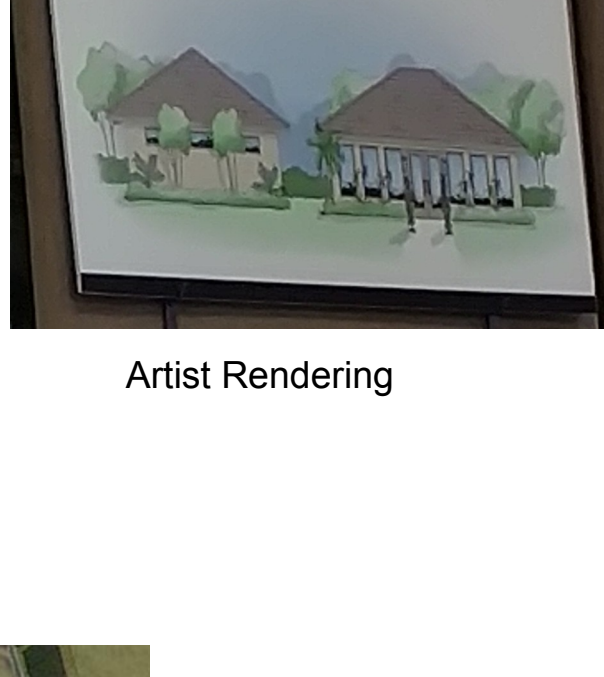
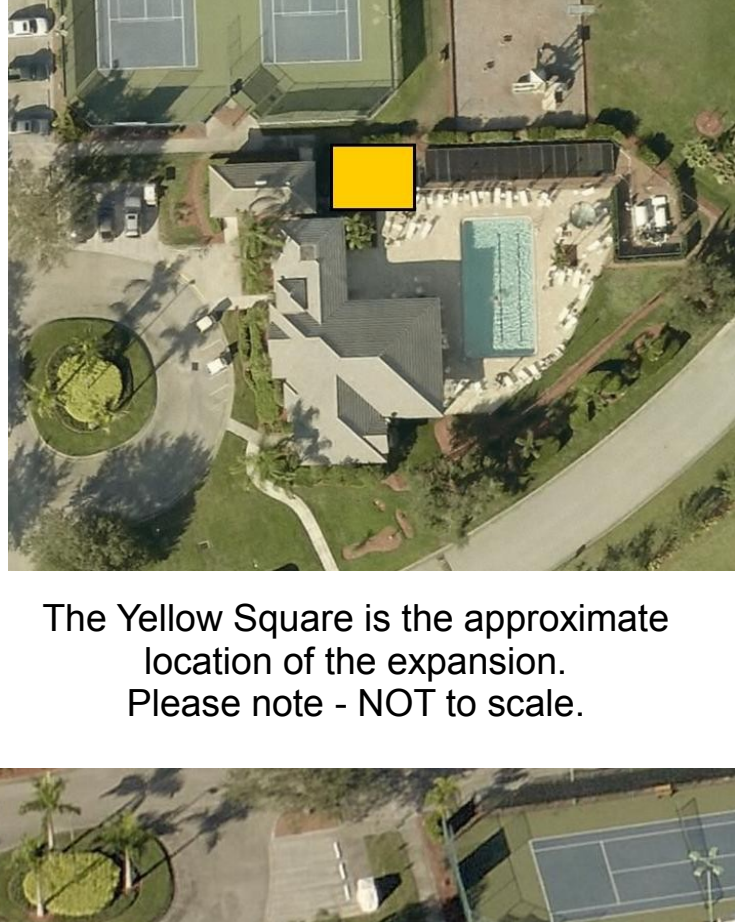
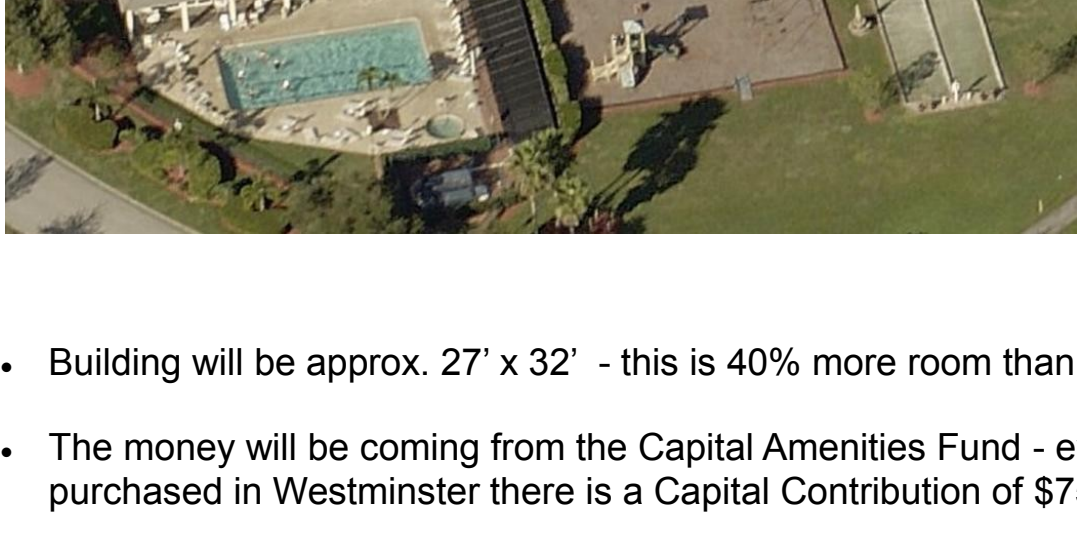


Community Center Expansion Project

The Yellow Square is the approximate location of the expansion. Please note - NOT to scale.



- Building will be approx. 27' x 32' - this is 40% more room than the current fitness center.
- The money will be coming from the Capital Amenities Fund - every time a home is purchased in Westminster there is a Capital Contribution of \$750 collected.
- There will be a price listed on the ballot/proxy that you will be voting with that the proposed building can cost no more than X Dollars. That price is currently being worked on.
- This expansion project will require 311 "In Favor of" votes to get done - if the votes or proxies do not total 311 in favor of the expansion it will NOT go forward.
- This will be discussed at the next Board Meeting on 2/16/16 at 7pm Community Center
- The Ballots and Proxies will be mailed around the 1st of March - be watching your mail as it is important for you to vote either "In Favor" or "Not In Favor" of this expansion project

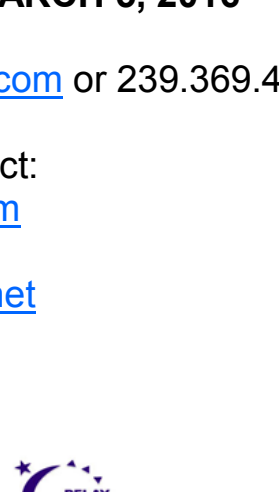
Card Making

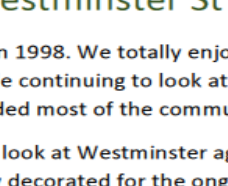

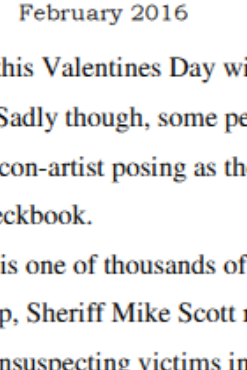

Beware of Online Cupid Aiming to Break Your Heart and Wallet

Many couples will celebrate this Valentines Day with cards, chocolates and sweet expressions of love for one another. Sadly though, some people will find themselves celebrating this romantic holiday with an online con-artist posing as the perfect soul mate in a relationship sure to break their heart and their checkbook.

If you or someone you know is one of thousands of people who have joined an online dating site looking for companionship, Sheriff Mike Scott reminds you that scammers constantly troll these websites looking to woo unsuspecting victims in a heartless game of "looking for love in all the wrong places."

These fraudulent romantics are experts in exploiting the vulnerability of their victim and can be difficult to spot unless you know what red flags to look for. Here are a few:

1. Their profile seems to disappear off the web site immediately after your conversations begins.
2. They immediately ask to exchange pictures
3. They claim to love you almost instantly, usually within the first week of talking.
4. They claim God brought you to him/her.
5. They claim to be from the U.S. but are overseas for business or family matters.
6. They avoid personal questions.
7. Ironically they share many things in common with you, such as the loss of a spouse/child/parent. Typically their story is tragic.
8. They declare their undying love through poetry, flowers and empty promises
9. As the fairy tale romance progresses, they eventually ask for money to help overcome a financial situation, or to cover travel costs so the two of you can meet.

Although these romances can be extremely exciting and fulfilling, these feelings are only temporary. The Lee County Sheriff's Office encourages all internet users who utilize online dating services, social networking sites, chat room and instant messaging sites to use common sense over feelings.
