Fraud Alert

Scammers Tricks are Targeting Lee County

Over the last several days, the Lee County Sheriff's Office Fraud Line has received dozens of calls from residents reporting two separate scams that are circulating our area at this time via the telephone and email. In response to these complaints, we urge you to remain vigilant in protecting your identity, credit card, and bank account information by familiarizing yourself with the information below:

1. Phone Scam Targets Comcast Cable Customers:

This scam is tricky and can appear to be legitimate due to scammers utilizing Caller ID to trick residents into believing that Comcast Cable is calling. The scammer claims to be a Comcast representative and advises the customer that hackers located outside of the United States have compromised their IP address and modem and a new IP address and modem must be issued to protect the customer's account.

The Trick: The "representative" says he needs to have remote access to your computer in order to correct the problem.

Your Response: Never give an unsolicited caller remote access to your computer no matter what large

telecommunications or computer company they say they are with. Never give your personal or financial information over the phone unless you made the call and the phone number came from a trusted source. If you receive a phone call like this, hang up!

2. Email Scam Claiming to be from the Federal Trade Commission: At first glance, this email appears to be from the FTC, but a closer looks reveals it was actually sent from a Gmail account, not the legitimate FTC.gov account. The email claims the recipient previously made a payment to a fraudulent "tech support" company (no specific name given) and after conducting a "proper" investigation they have determined a refund is in order. The email instructs the "victim" to call the phone number listed and use the invoice number provided in order to receive a refund.

The Trick: This is known as a "spoofing or phishing" scam, using deception to trick you into providing sensitive information, such as your bank account or social security number.

Your response: The Federal Trade Commission utilizes a government email account (.gov) not Gmail. Hit the Delete button!

Shredding Event Set for March 2nd

Do you have old bills, tax documents, health information or other personally identifiable paperwork that needs to be shredded? If so, you won't want to miss your opportunity to clear out your clutter and protect yourself from becoming a victim of identity theft by participating in our upcoming semi-annual Shred a Ton event. The Lee County Sheriff's Office and the Pilot Club of Fort Myers will once again partner in this community event on Saturday, March 2 from 9am-noon at the sheriff's office headquarters located at 14750 Six Mile Cypress Parkway.

Shredding will occur on site and representatives from the Sheriff's Office will be on hand to help drivers unload their boxes to be shredded. A donation of \$5 per box is suggested with all proceeds to benefit the sheriff's Project Lifesaver program. Participants are asked to remove all non-paper items such as paperclips, staples, binders, etc. Project Lifesaver is a program designed to track and locate individuals who wander and become lost due to Alzheimer's, Dementia and Autism through state of the art radio frequency tracking technology.
