Communication- Debris Removal

Thanks to the efforts of 5 dump trucks and 2 "clawed" bobcats on site yesterday, Westminster is 99% cleaned up. All of the heavy debris and brush pickups to date have been privately contracted by our community. There was no county assistance in this regard. If you have heavy items like dishwashers, refrigerators, etc., there is a county number you can call to arrange a pickup.
